## Access to Courts for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People in the ACT

## 2017/18 Action Plan

The ACT Courts Cultural Diversity Committee held a consultation workshop on 9 May 2017 with representatives from the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community, key agencies and NGO's to consider ways to improve access to courts for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the ACT. The Workshop Report (attached) made a number of recommendations which have been translated into the following key themes and action plan below.
