## **COVID-19 Measures – Revised Arrangements (No 3)**

This Practice Direction takes effect from 12 August 2021. The Practice Direction issued on 9 September 2020 is revoked.

## Special measures

- 1. The Chief Magistrate will conduct a hearing callover on **Friday 13 August 2021 at 9.30am** for all criminal hearings scheduled for 13 August 2021 and the week commencing Monday 16 August 2021.
- 2. All Magistrates Court lists will continue as planned subject to the below.
- 3. Parties may seek leave to appear remotely (whether by Webex or telephone) by emailing <a href="mailto:mclistings@courts.act.gov.au">mclistings@courts.act.gov.au</a> in circumstances where they are unable to appear in person due to COVID restrictions. Parties may use the below form for applications to appear remotely:

- 4. Parties whose matters cannot proceed at all, or whose matter may be adversely affected by COVID arrangements, are invited to apply for adjournments by emailing mclistings@courts.act.gov.au.
- 5. The following lists will operate remotely via Webex or telephone until further notice:
  - a. Registrar's directions lists and listing hearings scheduled on Tuesday at 2.15pm and 2.45pm respectively. Parties are encouraged to approach the Registrar for any consent orders that may be made in chambers;
  - b. Registrar's civil applications and enforcement list scheduled on Wednesday at 9.30am;
  - c. Children's Court conferencing;
  - d. Return of subpoenas list scheduled for Thursdays at 2.15pm;
  - e. Registrar's protection unit pre-hearing mention scheduled for Thursdays at 9.45am;
  - f. Fair work conferencing and civil mediations; and
  - g. Taxation.

Parties are required to email the Registrar at MCRegistrar@courts.act.gov.au with contact details.

6. Industrial court dispute resolution conferences (**DRC**) are adjourned until further notice to a date to be fixed. Parties are required to conduct an informal settlement conference in an effort to resolve the matter. Parties are to approach the Registrar for a revised date for a DRC if the matter does not settle at informal settlement conference.

- 7. Family violence and protection order conferences scheduled for Monday 16 August 2021 Friday 20 August 2021 are vacated. Parties will be advised of revised dates for conferences.
- 8. Physical distancing requirements and increased hygiene standards will continue to apply to all matters heard in the Magistrates and Childrens Court.
- 9. Practitioners are to take particular note of the order made under section 50 of the *Court Procedures Act 2004* which remains in force. Practitioners are to make their clients aware of the content of that order. A copy of the section 50 notice can be found at:

- 10. Unless a contrary direction is given, only those with a direct interest in the proceeding are to enter the designated court room.
- 11. Parties for any matter must not enter the room until invited to do so after the preceding matter and any hygiene requirements are completed.
- 12. The court registry counter is closed for over-the-counter filing of documents. Documents can be filed by:
  - i. eLodgement (where available for civil matters only); or
  - ii. email:
    - (a) civil matters: civil@courts.act.gov.au
    - (b) family violence, personal or workplace protection applications: protection@courts.act.gov.au;
    - (c) criminal matters: mccriminal@courts.act.gov.au or
  - iii. leaving hardcopy documents in a sealed envelope in the relevant post box in the foyer of the ACT Law Courts building.
- 13. All fees applicable under the Court Procedures (Fee Determination) 2021 remain payable.

In all cases, this practice direction is subject to judicial directions specific to a proceeding.
