## **NOTICE TO PRACTITIONERS Central Criminal Listing Periods 2023**

Central Criminal Listing Periods for 2023 are as follows:

### **January/February sittings**

- Week commencing 30 January 2023;
- Week commencing 6 February 2023; and
- Week commencing 13 February 2023.

### **March/April sittings**

- Week commencing 27 March 2023;
- Week commencing 3 April 2023;
- Week commencing 10 April 2023; and
- Week commencing 17 April 2023.

### **May/June sittings**

- Week commencing 22 May 2023;
- Week commencing 29 May 2023;
- Week commencing 5 June 2023;
- Week commencing 12 June 2023; and
- Week commencing 19 June 2023

### **July/August sittings**

- Week commencing 17 July 2023
- Week commencing 24 July 2023;
- Week commencing 31 July 2023; and

- Week commencing 7 August 2023.

#### **September/October sittings**

- Week commencing 18 September 2023
- Week commencing 25 September 2023;
- Week commencing 2 October 2023; and
- Week commencing 9 October 2023.

#### **November/December sittings**

- Week commencing 20 November 2023;
- Week commencing 27 November 2023; and
- Week commencing 4 December 2023

If circumstances require, the Court may sit to conduct trials on dates other than those listed above.

The list will be called over before a Judge so that dates can be allocated for future trial blocks. Each callover will be held at **9am** on the following dates unless otherwise advised by the court.

- Monday **21 November 2022** – for January/February and March/April sittings
- Monday **20 March 2023** – For May/June and July/August sittings
- Monday **1 May 2023** – for September/October sittings
- Monday **31 July 2023** – for November/December sittings
- Monday **20 November 2023** – For the first 2024 sitting (TBA)

At the call over the representatives of the parties should have full instructions and be prepared to advise the Court as to:

- whether the matter is to proceed by trial by jury or a trial by judge alone (election having been filed)
- any reason why a trial should be allocated to a particular judge
- whether there are any pre-trial applications or pre-trial hearings in the matter
- any prospects of the matter resolving without the need for a trial
- the names of counsel appearing in the matter
- counsel and witness unavailability during the sitting time
- the expected duration of the trial
- any requirement for CCTV, video conferencing or the recording of evidence
- any other relevant matter which could affect the hearing of the trial.

A trial date for each matter ready to proceed in the sittings will usually be given at the callover.
